Student Requirements for Team Capac Robotics # 2604

1. After School activities, training classes, fundraisers and Saturday events will be required for all team members. (July 1.-June 30)
2. Attendance with some Rookie mentoring events and all FIRST Competitions are mandatory.
3. Attendance will be taken. Excessive absences may result in dismissal from the team, no travel and or ineligibility for Varsity letter and cords. Students may be removed from the team for lack of participation or behavior that is inappropriate.
4. During competition, students will follow the rules of conduct or behavior and all procedures as required by the Capac student code of conduct. Violation will result in discipline measures as decided by the coaches/mentors. If at a distant site, the student may be sent home at the expense of the parents.
5. All students will follow the directives of the coaches/mentors at all times. Questions regarding these directives are to be done in private conversation with coaches/mentors.
6. Any team member receiving a referral or suspension from school may be subject to a review for possible dismissal from the team.
7. **Student must maintain a GPA of 2.50 (80%/ B- per the attached chart). Eligibility will be checked prior to build season and before each competition. Students deemed ineligible due to GPA or missing assignments will NOT be allowed to miss school to attend events.**
8. All students are required to obtain at minimum 30 hour of community service prior to the end of the competition season July 1-June 30. We will have group service activities that will fulfill part or all of this requirement. Students are expected to have 15 hours accrued by January 6th Kick-off.
9. Transportation for after school activities **MUST** be provided by a parent. The staff **CAN NOT** provide transportation. Regional and national event transportation will be arranged by the team; additional costs for hotel & meals may be necessary depending on extent of team fundraising. Students are encouraged to arrange car pools as much as possible.

1. **Exhibits Gracious Professionalism.**
2. **Academic Responsibility** (students must maintain an average 2.50 GPA (80% /B- per attached chart) School comes first!
3. **Team Player** (this is about being on a team)!
4. **Highly self-motivated** (there are “down times” that’s when you need to be “up”)
5. **Hard-working** (without ever being asked)
6. **Willing to learn and be open to new ideas** (and be able to handle constructive criticism)
7. **Willing to sacrifice other activities for FIRST** (Saturdays, sports, social events, dates)
8. **Willing to commit an extensive amount of time to the program** including:
 - A minimum 30 hours of community service (15 due by Jan 6th Kickoff)
 - Team-building activities & scheduled training Classes
 - Meetings as scheduled including off season; We are a year-round Team.
 - Outreach Activities (Open Houses, road cleanup, demos etc)
 - Fundraisers (presentations to potential corporate sponsors, car drives, dinners, car washes, pizza sales, etc.)
 - FIRST Rookie team and FLL team mentorship (if applicable)
 - Emergency meeting when needed
 - Corporate & University Partnership Meetings (if applicable)
 - Off-Season Events and Programs including FLL Expos and Mentoring
9. **Commitment to punctuality and good attendance**
Always inform the coach or Mentors in advance when you will not be able to attend a meeting, and find ways to make up for missed time. Students who do not attend at least 75% of scheduled meetings may be excluded from travel to competitions.
10. **Willing to exhibit spirit for the team** (may include cheers, but at the very least being supportive and celebrating our teams successes).
